Topic: School Refusal: Identification and Evidence-Based Intervention Strategies

Presenter: Daniela Colognori, Psy.D., Licensed Clinical Psychologist

Overview: School Refusal is one of the most vexing and impairing problem behaviors that affect childhood. An acute episode of school refusal can quickly become chronic and interfere in multiple domains of the youth and family's lives. There are many reasons that lead to students refusing school, and therefore identifying the primary function of the behavior is critical. Anxiety, depressed mood, and intolerance of negative affect are often at the root of school refusal. Successful intervention requires a concerted, coordinated effort involving the child, family, school and mental health professional. Attendees of the workshop will become familiar with methods to assess the factors maintaining a student's school refusal behavior and recommended intervention strategies.

About the Presenter: Dr. Daniela Colognori, Psy.D.

is a licensed clinical psychologist specializing in children, adolescents, and families with an emphasis on cognitive behavioral therapy for anxiety, mood, tic, and body focused repetitive behavior disorders. Dr. Colognori received her B.A. in psychology from Boston College and earned her Psy.D. in Clinical Psychology from the Graduate School of Applied and Professional Psychology at Rutgers University in 2010. She completed her pre-doctoral internship at Geisinger Medical Center in Pennsylvania, providing evidence-based treatment for children and adolescents in the outpatient department as well as consultation/liaison services for youth being treated for medical conditions at Janet Weis Children's Hospital. Dr. Colognori went on to further specialize in CBT for youth with anxiety disorders during her post-doctoral fellowship at the NYU Child Study Center, working in NJ schools to train counselors in an evidence-based program for adolescents with social anxiety disorder. Dr. Colognori held an Assistant Professor position in the Combined School & Clinical Psychology doctoral program at Kean University in Union, NJ from 2012-2015, teaching graduate courses in Developmental Psychology, Child Psychopathology, and Evidence-based Psychological Treatment for Children and Adolescents. Currently, Dr. Colognori is the Clinical Director of the Tourette Syndrome Clinic at the Graduate School of Applied and Professional Psychology at Rutgers University and sees clients in her practice, Specialized Psychological Services, in Short Hills, NJ.
